

A note from the Director:

Written around 1595, Shakespeare's timeless story of Romeo & Juliet is as relevant today as it was over 400 years ago. There is no specificity as to what the ancient grudge between the dignified houses of Montague and Capulet is about; as with most all violent feuds, the why is outweighed by the collateral damage. Thus countless adaptations have since been produced to tell this story of individual people finding love in each other amongst vehemently divided backgrounds.

This production takes place in an abstract setting blending contemporary society with the Renaissance Italy in which Shakespeare originally set Romeo & Juliet (as he often chose this setting for many of his plays as a free-er environment than his own repressed Elizabethan England). While some characters are dressed in period costumes, they all represent the multitude of identities that make up our modern world across gender identity, race, sexual preference, religion, class, and politics.

Dividing this play into two distinct groups is too simple: as one of the most profound writers of all time, Shakespeare saw and wrote people as they truly were and are—layered and complicated. What divides us in the surface labels some people choose to box others into is not as strong as the well underneath of what unites us in our common humanity and experience.

With this in mind, Players Temple humbly hopes you enjoy our production of Romeo & Juliet with its themes of love versus hate, unity versus division, and fate versus action. Thank you.




